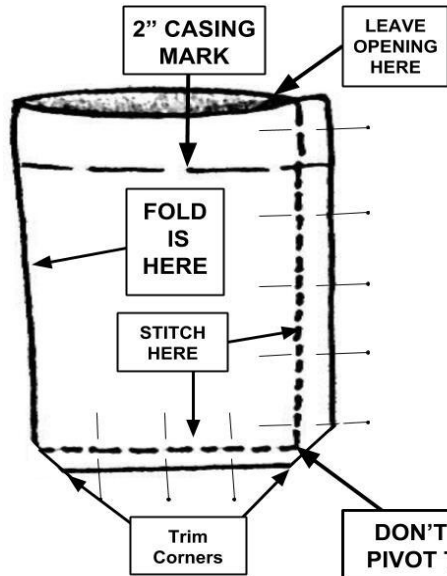


STEP #3 - STITCH DRAWSTRING BAG:



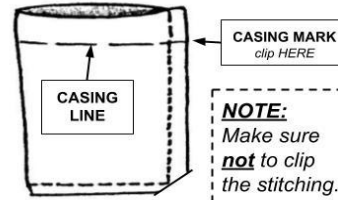
Stitch the fabric around the two sides of the bag.
IN THIS ORDER:

- Set stitch length to a 5. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance, stitch from the top of the bag to the casing marking.
- At the casing marking, put a little backstitch at the mark.
- Change the stitch length to a 2 (*original setting*)
- Stitch the side of the bag, down to the bottom. **PIVOT THE CORNERS.**
- Stitch across the bottom of the bag. Backstitch.

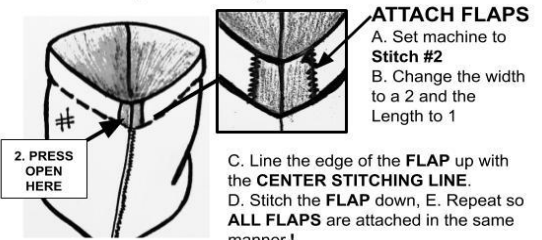
DON'T FORGET TO PIVOT THE CORNER

STEP #4 - EDGE FINISHES:

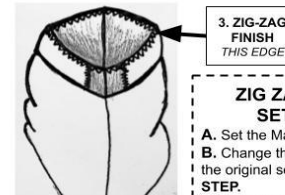
- Put a little clip at the **CASING MARK**.
- PRESS** open seam allowance section at the top of the bag, on both sides.



NOTE:
Make sure not to clip the stitching.

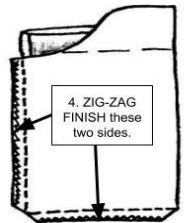


- ZIG-ZAG FINISH** around the **TOP EDGE** of the bag so it makes an open circle.
- ZIG-ZAG FINISH** the **SIDES** and **BOTTOM** of the bag.



ZIG ZAG FINISH SETTINGS:
A. Set the Machine to Stitch #2.
B. Change the settings back to the original settings for **THIS STEP.**

- Use the same setting as **STEP #3.**
- Starting below the casing mark, stitch the edges around the sides and bottom of the bag.
- Make sure the stitch is stitching over the edge of the fabric. (on and off the edge).

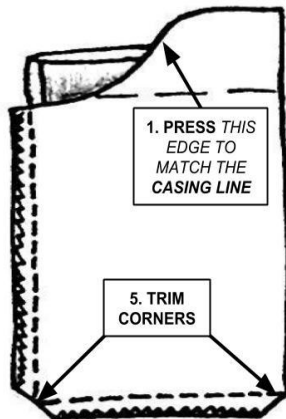

**CHECKPOINT
STOP - GET A SIGN-OFF**

STEP #5 - FORM THE CASING

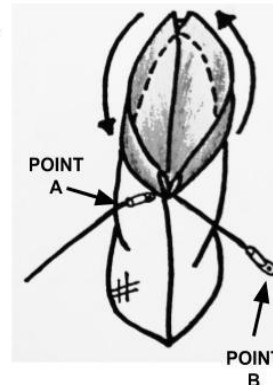
- FOLD** the top edge down so that the top edge matches up with the **CASING LINE**.
- PRESS** the the fold so that it creases.
- Match the top edge of the fabric to the **CENTER STITCH LINE**.
- ZIG-ZAG** stitch over the **ZIG-ZAG** finish stitch that you just made on the edge.



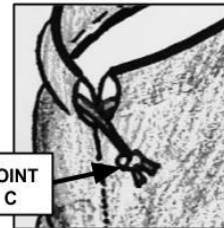
- TRIM** the corners. **DO NOT** cut your stitches in the corners.

STEP #6 - DRAWSTRING

- Get your drawstring from the teacher.
- Attach a pin to the end of the drawstring.



- Insert the safety pin as shown. **DIAGRAM: POINT A**
- Pull the string through the casing all the way around, so it comes out the same side as it went in. **DIAGRAM: POINT B**



- Even up your drawstring ends. (**MAKE SURE ENDS ARE EXACTLY EVEN**). Tie them together in a knot, as shown. **POINT C**

DEFINITIONS:

- BASTE:** Change your stitch length to a 5 to make a temporary stitch.
CASING: An opening for elastic or drawstring to go through.

CHECKPOINT - STOP - GET A SIGN-OFF
